The 2020 FVWS Calendar will be a fundraiser for FVWS, a way to highlight the work of FVWS artists, and a way to promote our art in the community. If you are planning to submit a painting for the calendar, bring your unframed / no glass painting on Thu 25 April (one entry per artist) when paintings will be photographed. When you submit a painting, provide the name of the painting, the artist name, the medium, the size, and a one-sentence description (including the price of the painting is optional). Based on a lottery system, 13 paintings for the calendar will be picked for the cover and monthly painting. Other paintings will appear in smaller sizes throughout the calendar. If your painting is selected, you will need to pay a \$5 fee. You can also buy an ad in the calendar or a bottom banner for \$100 — contact Mary for details. Watch for further details.

Websites of the month

In the commune of Les Baux-de-Provence in southern France sits the Carrières de Lumières, or Quarries of Lights. A former limestone quarry that closed down in the 1930s, the site has been transformed into an immersive multimedia exhibit space dedicated to art and music. Projectors mounted around the quarry paint the walls, ceiling, and floors with light, bringing both still and animated images of artwork to life across the entire space. Gathered here are images from recent exhibitions, featuring artwork from van Gogh, Klimt, da Vinci, and many other artists.

Spring Show preparation

4 April: voting on painting for door prize (winner receives \$175)

12 April: deadline for submitting 'show planner' sheets: your name, painting name, medium, size, price. Bring these sheets to a meeting, send the information to the FVWS email.

25 April: deadline for submission of 'apple paintings for the Library Display Window.

Fri 10 May (10.00 - 12.00). Drop off paintings. Please place them with images facing the wall so that hanging / backing details can be checked. Hanging fee: \$5 per painting, if more than five paintings submitted handing fee is \$25.

Tue 21 May (10am): Pick up paintings

All paintings are to be originals, first time exhibited, and nothing from workshops or demos.

Just a reminder to check the <u>guidelines in the Membership Booklet</u> for information on <u>pricing</u> your paintings and on <u>matting</u>, <u>framing</u>, <u>wires</u>, <u>backing</u>, and so on. Black backing paper (thin, not so thick as last year) can be obtained at HoFA. Paintings will not be hung if they do not meet these hanging guidelines. See: fvwatermediasociety.com

The Hanging Committee (that is, members of the Executive) decides which paintings are hung where. The focus of the show is on the FVWS, not individual members. Paintings will be arranged and hung by size, color, theme, and so on, when possible. Some paintings will be placed at the front to catch the eye of passersby; some will be hung at the back to draw visitors into the exhibition. All hanging decisions are final.

A note re the apple paintings for the library display window: On 11 April, there will be an opportunity to prepare an apple painting. If you are submitting an apple painting, note that matted watercolours MAY display more easily but please submit without if you choose. If your name is on the painting (front or back) it will be returned. It's possible that not all paintings will be needed; it depends on display space and number of paintings brought in.
